Hong Kong rose to rank fifth in World Competitiveness Yearbook 2024

In the latest World Competitiveness Yearbook (WCY) 2024 published by the International Institute for Management Development (IMD), Hong Kong's ranking improved by two places to fifth globally.

Among the four competitiveness factors in the WCY 2024, Hong Kong's rankings in "Business efficiency" and "Infrastructure" rose notably and came within the top 10 globally. The ranking in "Government efficiency" also stayed high among the top three. The ranking in "Economic performance" saw significant improvement, reflecting the economic recovery in 2023.

As regards the sub-factors, Hong Kong topped the rankings in "International trade" and "Business legislation", and was among the global top five in "Tax policy", "International investment", "Basic infrastructure", "Finance" and "Education".

A spokesperson of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) Government noted on June 18 that the IMD's WCY 2024 continued to recognise Hong Kong as one of the most competitive economies in the world. The HKSAR Government has launched an array of measures to bolster market confidence and has organised mega events to bolster tourism and consumption, with a view to consolidating the momentum of economic recovery.

He further remarked that Hong Kong is vigorously attracting enterprises, capital and talent from around the world to Hong Kong, proactively driving the development of areas including financial services, innovation and technology, and trading where Hong Kong enjoys an edge, and embracing green transformation and digital economy development.

Hong Kong's UGC-funded universities highly rated in QS World University Rankings 2025

The World University Rankings 2025 published by Quacquarelli Symonds (QS), an international higher education organisation, highly rated Hong Kong's University Grants Committee (UGC)-funded universities. The rankings of six universities have risen, with five of them staying in the world's top 100.

The Education Bureau of the HKSAR Government remarked on June 5 that the ranking results highlight that Hong Kong's universities are highly reputable in the global academic community, with excellent performances in terms of quality of teaching and research, and internationalisation. The results also add confidence and cohesion to the Government's commitment to developing Hong Kong into an international education hub and a cradle of future talent.

The results on creative thinking in the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) 2022 announced on June 18 showed that the performance of 15-year-old Hong Kong students was on par with the international average.

The results of this study also showed that Hong Kong students had displayed better performance in evaluating and improving ideas, and relatively stronger capabilities in social problem solving. The results once again demonstrated Hong Kong's remarkable performance in terms of education equity, ranking first among countries or economies with high academic achievements.

Hong Kong payload specialist candidate selected at fourth batch of preparatory astronauts

The China Manned Space Agency announced on June 11 the completion of the recruitment of the fourth batch of preparatory astronauts. One of the selected preparatory astronauts is a payload specialist from Hong Kong.

The Chief Executive of the HKSAR, Mr John Lee, remarked that this is the first time that a HKSAR citizen has been selected as a preparatory astronaut, specifically a payload specialist, under the National Manned Space Programme after an extremely rigorous selection process. The payload specialist may have the opportunity to conduct scientific research in space and contribute to the country's aerospace development. This writes glorious history for the HKSAR and makes the whole of Hong Kong proud.

The fourth batch of preparatory astronauts will later receive training at the China Astronaut Research and Training Center.

Old identity cards to be invalidated in phases in 2025

Following the conclusion of the Territory-wide Identity Card Replacement Exercise on March 3 2023, the HKSAR Government announced on June 18 that the old form of smart identity cards issued before November 26, 2018 (old ID cards), will be invalidated in two phases in 2025.

Phase I of the invalidation exercise will cover holders of old ID cards born in 1970 or after, whose old cards will become invalid on May 12, 2025. Phase II of the invalidation exercise will cover holders of old ID cards born in 1969 or before, whose old cards will become invalid on October 12, 2025.

A spokesman for the Immigration Department (ImmD) of the HKSAR Government reminded that residents still holding old ID cards should make appointments for replacement as soon as possible. For those who are unable to have their ID cards replaced during the specified call-up periods due to being absent from Hong Kong, they should replace their ID cards within 30 days of their return to Hong Kong.

The spokesman further stressed that the invalidation of old ID cards will not affect the right of abode in Hong Kong of the holders of old ID cards unless he or she has lost permanent resident status under the Immigration Ordinance.
