The HKSAR Government has been proactively allocating resources to develop elite sports in the past decade or so to ensure the provision of the best training facilities for athletes by setting up the Elite Athletes Development Fund, providing scholarships and learning support for elite athletes' dual career development in sports and academics, and improving retirement arrangements for athletes.

The Government will continue to provide more sports facilities for hosting international competitions. The Kai Tak Sports Park, the largest sports infrastructure project in Hong Kong's history, will open in the first half of 2025 and support Hong Kong's sports development in a more comprehensive manner.

A number of important sports events will also take place shortly, including the 2024 Paris Paralympic Games in late August, as well as the 15th National Games, the 12th National Games for Persons with Disabilities and the 9th National Special Olympic Games to be cohosted by Guangdong, Hong Kong and Macao towards the end of next year.

Hong Kong's sewage surveillance programme wins IWA Project Innovation Awards

The Territory-wide Sewage Surveillance Programme launched in Hong Kong was awarded the Gold Award of the 2024 International Water Association (IWA) Project Innovation Awards under the category of "Performance Improvement and Operational Solutions". The Awards Gala Dinner was held at the IWA World Water Congress & Exhibition in Toronto, Canada on August 13.

The interdepartmental team, comprising the Environmental Protection Department, the Drainage Services Department and the Department of Health, has implemented a unique territory-wide sewage surveillance programme that combated COVID-19 by using sewage surveillance to provide important data to assist anti-epidemic measures during the most severe epidemic situation in Hong Kong, and brought about significant socioeconomic benefits.

Standing out from 108 submissions worldwide, this internationally recognised achievement fully acknowledges the HKSAR Government's innovative spirit and outstanding technological achievements in using sewage surveillance to help combat the epidemic.

The IWA is the world's largest professional organisation in the water sector, bringing together water professionals from 140 countries/areas to explore smart water usage and seek solutions to global water resource challenges.

Hong Kong wins in APEC Energy Smart Communities Initiative Best Practices Awards Program

The award ceremony of the sixth Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Energy Smart Communities Initiative (ESCI) Best Practices Awards Program was held in Lima, Peru on August 13. A total of 62 projects from 13 APEC member economies participated in the selection. Hong Kong won one gold and two silver awards among the 10 awards this year.

The three winning projects by Hong Kong are:

- Power-hawk Inspector: a drone-based power grid defect inspector with embedded artificial intelligence (AI) using few-shot learning and federated learning, by the Hong Kong Productivity Council (HKPC), received the gold award in the Smart Grids category.
- E&M AI Lab: Driving Digital Transformation in Building Facilities Management, by the Electrical and Mechanical Services Department, received the silver award in the Smart Buildings category.
- Renewable Energy and Retired EV Battery Solution for Smart Grid Integration, by the HKPC, received the silver award in the Smart Grids category.

The APEC Energy Working Group launched the biennial APEC ESCI Best Practices Awards in 2013 to recognise exemplary community-level projects that integrate renewable energy and energy efficiency technologies for sustainable development in the APEC region.

Mrs Yeung strongly encouraged young aspiring people who are committed to serving the community to actively consider joining the civil service. She said that it is encouraging to note that this round of Internship Programme has attracted a record high number of applications from a total of 303 students from local, Mainland and overseas universities.

AOs play a pivotal role in the Government and are responsible for the formulation of government policies, co-ordination and monitoring of the implementation of various programmes, and management of the use of public resources.

The Civil Service Bureau organises the Administrative Service Internship Programme every summer and winter, offering students who wish to pursue an AO career an opportunity to work with serving AOs for around eight weeks, thereby gaining practical experience of government work at an early stage to facilitate future planning.

Applications open for Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fellowships and Scholarships for Overseas Studies 2025/26

The Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund Council reminded interested applicants that the closing date for applications for its Fellowships and Scholarships for Overseas Studies (including the award for students with disabilities) for the 2025/26 academic year is September 6, 2024.

The fellowships and scholarships aim at encouraging outstanding students to pursue further studies in renowned institutions overseas. Successful candidates are expected to have a strong sense of commitment to Hong Kong and be ready to contribute to the community upon graduation.

The fellowships are for studies leading to postgraduate degrees either by research or coursework. The maximum value of a fellowship is HK\$300,000 per year, tenable for up to three years for a doctoral degree or two years for a master's degree. The scholarships are for studies leading to undergraduate degrees with the maximum value of HK\$280,000 per year, tenable for up to three years.

Recruitment of non-locally trained dentists

Following the passage of the Dentists Registration (Amendment) Bill 2024 by the Legislative Council, the Department of Health (DH) of the HKSAR formally commenced the recruitment of non-locally trained dentists.

With the phased implementation of the amended provisions starting from 2025, qualified non-locally trained dentists will be allowed to practise in Hong Kong. Dentists who are interested in practising in Hong Kong and granted a conditional offer after the interview may submit a limited registration or special registration application to the Dental Council of Hong Kong, and upon approval directly practise at the DH.
